

Pupil Premium 2016 - 17

In the year 2016/17 Wroxall Primary was allocated £66,500 of Pupil Premium funding.

Percentage of children registered as Pupil Premium: 29%

At Wroxall Primary School we look at each pupil eligible for Pupil Premium (PP). We analyse how to allocate the money to maximise the benefit to each individual, academically as well as socially and emotionally.

Our aim is to support and inspire children to 'aim high'. We record how PP is spent for each child, and monitor their progress academically and the impact of the spend in other areas of their life.

There are some individual pupil specific needs but the main barriers to educational achievement have been identified as:

- Social, emotional and mental health issues
- Low baseline – historically pupils have entered school below national expectations
- Poor attendance
- Poor aspirations

Our strategies to help overcome these barriers are outlined below:

Strategy	Cost	Impact
Staff – classroom support to improve teaching and learning. Booster classes, intervention groups, TA training, S&L support, ELKLAN training.	£22,000	Disadvantaged attainment for the combined score in Year 6 (55%) was above that of other pupils in the school cohort (53%), although still below national average. Progress measures for disadvantaged children are also higher than those for other pupils in the school cohort.
Breakfast club	£3000	Improvements to punctuality and attendance noted for identified children.
Residential (all children)	£2000	Improvements in social interaction and new cultural experiences provided for pupils.
Trips and visitors (all children)	£3000	Exposure to new experiences to raise aspirations and widen world-view.
After-school clubs	£3000	Opportunities provided to try new experiences and develop self-esteem and confidence to persevere.
Events –Global rock, Music Festivals, Sports	£1500	Development of social skills and links with other schools; promoting self-esteem.
Family Support worker Non-teaching SENco	£22,000	Early help support provided to families in need; emotional support for pupils easily accessible; attendance support.
Specialised Curriculum support (Musical Instrument Hire)	£500	Opportunities to try different instruments throughout the school year, with the option to then take these up privately.
Learning Support Programmes- Phonics, Mathematics, Spellodrome	£1000	All children gain a good grounding in structured synthetic phonics and maths.

Resources- reading books, Numicon Scheme tuition	£500	Resources enable children to make good progress.
Chillout Club	£4000	Pre-prepared activities carefully planned by staff in advance to ensure that children have access to homework resources (computers), and to accommodate children for after school and extended schools provision.
Miscellaneous- Uniform, snacks, lunch,	£500	Ensuring self-confidence and daily welfare.
Brass Music Lessons specifically for PP6 children	£3000	Confidence gained in a new skill sometimes out of reach for disadvantaged families.
