

# Wroxall Primary School Home-School Agreement

### Home-school agreement

#### As a school we will:

- Provide a safe and secure learning environment.
- Provide a broad and balanced curriculum, which challenges pupils to reach their potential, fulfils the requirements of the national curriculum and is adapted to meet the needs of all children.
- Promote good attendance and punctuality.
- Teach and encourage pupils to do their best and achieve their full potential as a valued member of the school community.
- Promote positive values and a caring attitude towards the school community.
- Celebrate your child's academic and personal achievements.
- Teach your child to develop a positive attitude of themselves, and of one another, regardless of gender, race, sexuality, culture and belief.
- Offer opportunities for parents to become involved in the daily life of the school.
- Establish good relationships and communication with parents/carers so that there is a united commitment to your child's learning, well-being and development.
- Communicate between home and school through emails, texts, newsletters, the school website, social media and general meetings.
- Contact parents when concerns are raised about a pupil's work, behaviour, attendance or punctuality.
- Have a clear and consistent approach to rewards and sanctions for pupils, as set out in the school's Behaviour Policy.
- Keep parents informed about their child's progress and behaviour, as well as their termly curriculum.
- Welcome parental input and respond to questions or concerns as quickly as possible.
- Encourage your child to be independent and resilient, developing initiative and adaptability for their lives in the future.
- Allow pupils safe and secure use of the internet. This will be achieved through a combination of site
  filtering, supervision and by fostering a responsible attitude in all pupils, in partnership with parents, to
  implement a whole-school approach to online safety.

#### As a parent I will:

- Accept the school's aims, values, policies and procedures to positively support the school.
- Make sure that my child attends school regularly and punctually, unless there is a good reason not to.
   The school gates open at 8:20am and are locked promptly at 8:30am. Children should be in class and learning by 8:30am each day.
- Notify the school by email or telephone in the event of absence before 9:00 am on the first day of any
  absence, keeping the school updated each day. I will provide a written explanation of the reason my
  child was absent (email or written note) within one week of the absence. I understand that without a
  good reason, provided in writing, the school will be unable to authorise any absences.
- Endeavour to provide a safe, secure and happy environment at home for my child, supporting them
  with homework and other opportunities for home learning. I will let school know if there are any
  changes at home which could affect my child's wellbeing.
- Encourage a positive attitude towards my child's education and the school, supporting and upholding the school's policies and guidelines on learning, behaviour, attendance and uniform.
- Support my child with homework that is set and ensure that this is completed on time according to school arrangements.
- Promptly inform the school of any concerns or problems that may affect my child's learning, behaviour or happiness at school.
- Stay informed and up to date with the school community by regularly reading notices, newsletters, the school website, texts and emails.
- Support the school through encouraging my child to develop a positive attitude and mutual respect and understanding of those with different faiths, beliefs and protected characteristics, in line with British values.
- Support the school in the teaching of safe and secure internet use at home.
- Attend parent meetings with teachers to discuss my child's achievements and progress.
- Inform the school immediately of any changes to my emergency contacts details.
- Attend meetings with my child's teacher, aiming to be positive and productive in order to support moving my child on in their learning.

#### As a pupil I will:

- Follow the school rules of being Ready, Respectful and Safe in all I do.
- Aim to show the school's CARE values through my work and attitude within school:
  - embracing challenge
  - striving for new achievement
  - showing **resilience** in all we do
  - **enjoyment** through celebrating our successes
- Work hard and listen carefully to instructions.
- Attend school in the correct uniform.
- Attend school regularly and on time.
- Behave in line with the school's Behaviour Policy at all times to maintain the safety of myself and others.
- Be polite, friendly and helpful to other pupils and adults.
- Tell a member of staff if there is something I am not happy about.
- Do my homework regularly and return it to school on time.
- Bring all the equipment I need to school but refrain from bringing items such as toys, from home so these do not distract me from my learning.
- I will look after my belongings and make sure that anything I bring from home is stored securely in my school bag on my peg during lessons.
- Take good care of the school environment.
- Always try my best.
